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1. CHAIR'S REPORT: LEX CHALMERS (CHAIR)

Greetings from New Zealand.

A while ago I wrote some notes to corresponding members of the Commission in the warmth of December, these are written in the depth of a New Zealand winter. Being geographers, most of you will know that we don't see snow during winter in Waikato, but it is cool and wet and we have the much shortened days of winter. The option of meeting colleagues in the northern hemisphere in the next month or so is really very attractive.

Developments around the Tunis IGU Congress.

In the December Newsletter I reminded corresponding members about the IGU Congress in Tunis on August 25-29 2008. As I write, we are expecting to see the second circular from the Organising Committee, and we should be able to make some firm recommendations after we see what is proposed. I think we have some advantages in our planning as I took the opportunity to visit Tunis in April, and I can provide some guidance to the Commission's decision making. I will prepare an outline proposal to take to Commission members when we see the second circular, and I hope to have the opportunity to talk through some of the issues when we come together in the two remaining regional conferences (Lucerne and Beijing) that we have this year.

During my April visit, I spoke to the Congress education spokesperson from the Ministry of Education, Mdme Naziha Ferchichi. We hope to attract geography educators from the Maghreb to the meeting. However, I don't think there is the desire or capacity to run a local Commission meeting independent of the Congress. The Commission will be considering the following points:

- Some of us will be involved with the International Olympiad, but other Congress attendees will be offered a range of pre-conference field trips that we may be able attend as a collective group. We will look for a Commission member available to manage this option. I think we can book events specifically for Commission members from the Congress list during the Congress (for example, we should do at least a half day Carthage Trip, visit the Medina and the Bardo Museum is wonderful).
- I will recommend that we run a programme <u>within</u> the Congress format, offering to organise sessions, perhaps in association with Herodot, the AAG and INLT. We will offer to produce a refereed publication for all those who present papers in Commission sessions, and we have prospective editors.
- I think the Commission will have an independent space within Le Kram, with facilities to seat and present papers to up 60 people. I think this will accommodate all but the largest Commission sessions and we will ask for the normal conference presentation facilities as well as pin-boards, secure storage and an administrative space.

I can advise attendees on hotel selection, having seen rooms in seven potential Congress options.
I think there would be benefits if those participating in the Commission activities stayed at a small number of hotels, and I would propose that we organise an ice-breaker drinks session before the Congress opens at a hotel, and a Commission Dinner during the Congress.

Putting these activities in place may take some effort, but we are fortunate to have had such a successful meeting in Brisbane, that we are carried forward a surplus of more than \$A2,500. This was really great news, and the Commission is very grateful to John Lidstone and Donna Bennett for their most effective efforts on our behalf.
