Keynote speeches were delivered by three thought-leaders on geography education: Jean-François Thémines, Normandy University, ESO (France), Nicola Walshe, UCL

(London), and Rafael De Miguel González, President of EUROGEO. In addition to the paper presentations, the conference program featured various academic and social offerings including workshops, symposiums, excursions, and a gala dinner. There was also a workshop for early career researchers, during which participants had the opportunity to share challenges in geography education research, understand the paper

writing and publication process, and network with each other. We would like to thank the organizing committee for making the conference a success. In particular, we appreciate Caroline Leininger and Magali Hardouin and their team for such a well-planned and enjoyable conference.












Walk around the old town area of Rennes
